NAPLAN 2023

Year 3 students will complete NAPLAN online with writing tests still pencil and paper.

Students will complete the tests in the order of writing, reading, language conventions and numeracy.

Opportunity classes located in government primary schools cater for academically gifted Year 5 and Year 6 students with high potential. These classes help students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, using specialised teaching methods and educational materials at the appropriate level.

The <u>Selective Education Unit</u> administers the opportunity class placement process.

Parents apply when students are in Year 4.

Online applications for Year 5 placement in an opportunity class in 2024 open on Thursday 30 March 2023 and close on <u>Monday 15 May</u> 2023.

The Opportunity Class Placement Test will be conducted on Thursday 27 July 2023.

Mobile Phone Policy

- Use of personal digital devices during school time is not allowed – this includes mobile phones, laptops, tablets and smartwatches.
- Students should only bring a mobile phone to school if it is absolutely necessary e.g. travel alone to and from school
- Students must sign the 'Appropriate Use of Mobile Phones at School Agreement' before bringing a phone to school.
- Mobile phones must be signed in and out at the office everyday. They must not be used on school grounds.

- If you need to contact your child during school hours, you must call the school office.
